RESIDENTIAL SHELTER

Our stable, home-like Residential Shelter provides families of all types a warm and safe family-centered community. Each family is provided with their own private residential room, daily nutritious meals, and clothing.

While at Raphael House, family members participate in a wide range of activities and services that strengthen the whole family as they work toward achieving long-term stable housing and other self-determined goals.

BRIDGE PROGRAM

Through our post-shelter Bridge Program, we are committed to helping families reach and maintain long-term stability by supporting them with the resources and connections they need to move beyond poverty.

Once families leave our shelter and join our Bridge Program, they have access to the same variety of services we offer to help them set goals and overcome barriers to maintaining housing and stability.
